The Mental Health Work Certificate of Achievement will serve both as workforce development for *entry level positions* in the mental health and human services field and as an academic stepping stone toward *higher academic degrees* in the field of mental health. The certificate is offered through the Public Mental Health Academy, offering specialized academic counseling and support to students enrolled in the certificate as well as an annual conference for mental health workers and mental health career fair with participation from community partners in the health and human services sector.
